Dear Madam Secretary:

We are writing to request an update on matters relating to the Republic of Palau (Palau), the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM), and the Republic of the Marshall Islands (RMI). These nations were part of the former-U.N. Trust Territory of the Pacific Islands which was administered by the U.S. until they achieved sovereign self-government some 20 years ago under their respective Compacts of Free Association with the U.S. The Compacts established the framework for security and economic relations including the extension of U.S. financial and program assistance to Palau through the U.S. Department of the Interior and other domestic agencies. The Compacts also set forth requirements for regular reviews and reports to help ensure consideration of issues of mutual concern. Of specific concern to us are: the Administration's recommendation on future assistance to Palau; the report on U.S. intentions regarding Kwajalein Atoll; and a status report on the 5-year Review of the FSM and the RMI Compacts.

- 1) Palau: Section 432 of P.L.99-658 provides that the U.S. and Palau will formally review the Compact and commit themselves to take specific measures in response to Review findings. In a May 24, 2007 letter (attached), members of Congress urged the Administration to accelerate this Review so that Congress would have adequate time to enact any recommended legislation before termination of the current 15-year term of Compact assistance on October 1, 2009. We now believe that there is no longer a reasonable prospect of completing the Review, and developing and enacting legislation before the October 1, 2009 deadline. Accordingly, we recommend extension of the current terms of financial and program assistance to October 1, 2010, and that the Administration transmit the results and recommendations of the Review to Congress by October 1, 2009. We further ask that the Department, as a drafting service, provide the Committee as soon as possible with legislative language needed to make this one year extension.
- 2) <u>Kwajalein</u>: Section 103(l)(4)(B) of P.L.108-188 requires that, if no agreement amending or superseding the 1982 Kwajalein land use agreement (LUA) is concluded by December 17, 2008, then the President shall report to Congress on the intentions of the U.S. regarding the use of Kwajalein Atoll after 2016. We understand that no such LUA agreement was concluded, but that an agreement was concluded regarding the land use payments that are being held in escrow pending the conclusion of a new LUA. We request that the Administration submit this report to Congress describing recent developments, major changes in base operations, and local political developments that are likely to affect U.S. access to the atoll and overall relations with the RMI.
- 3) FSM/RMI 5-year review: Section 104(h)(2) of P.L.108-188 requires that the U.S. review the terms of the Compacts and consider the overall nature and development of the U.S.-FSM and

> U.S.-RMI relationships during the fifth, tenth, and fifteenth, years after enactment. Among the areas to be covered by the report, we are particularly concerned about the FSM's lack of progress at promoting private sector development and increasing local revenue. These trends indicate that per capita incomes are declining, dependence on U.S. assistance is growing, and many FSM citizens are seeking opportunities in the U.S. instead of at home. We look forward to hearing about the status of the Review and to your recommendations on ways to improve the effectiveness of U.S. assistance and the performance of the FSM and RMI toward meeting Compact objectives.

> While these nations are relatively small and remote, they are among our nation's closest and most reliable allies. We would like to be reassured that the laws governing our relations are being fully implemented and that these relationships are receiving proper attention. We look forward to an update and to working with you to assure timely compliance with the provisions of the Compact Acts. Thank you in advance for your assistance.

Republicans oppose Obama pick for Iraq ambassador By ANNE FLAHERTY Associated Press Writer 03-12-2009 18-53

WASHINGTON (AP) At least three Republican senators have said that President Barack Obarna should reconsider his pick to become the next U.S. ambassador to Iraq, dimming the chances that Christopher Hill could be confirmed.

Sens. John McCain of Arızona, Lindsey Graham of South Carolina and Sam Brownback of Kansas said this week that they were disappointed with Hill's appointment, which was announced Wednesday by Obama.

During the Bush administration, Hill led nuclear disarmament talks with North Korea. While considered a seasoned negotiator, Hill was regarded by many Republicans as too willing to make concessions to try to prod Pyongyang to give up its nuclear weapons.

If confirmed Hill would replace Ryan Crocker as America's top

diplomat in Baghdad

The swift negative reaction from Congress does not bode well for Hill's appointment. He would have to be confirmed by the Senate, where Democrats hold a narrow majority and procedural rules require 60 votes to cut off debate

All three senators cited a lack of experience in the Middle East to explain their opposition to Hill.

Brownback also referred to his "evasive and unprofessional" past dealings with Congress, while McCain and Graham referred to his "controversial legacy" in a joint statement released late Thursday

"The U.S embassy in Baghdad is the world's largest, and our next ambassador will take the helm at a particularly critical time in our efforts in Iraq," Graham and McCain wrote. "The next ambassador should have experience in the Middle East and in working closely with the U.S. military in counterinsurgency or counterterrorism operations. Mr. Hill has neither."

Improving Prevention and Management of Chronic Disease-the Functional Medicine Model

A consensus is emerging today among many key stakeholders – patients, providers, and policymakers – that our healthcare system requires a comprehensive overhaul. Physicians are disenchanted; patients are dissatisfied with treatment outcomes; employers can't continue to absorb double-digit increases in prescription drug spending; and despite spending \$2.5 trillion per year on health care (2008 figures)¹, the U.S. ranks 37th in quality of health outcomes.² The situation is increasingly insupportable – and yet, we continue to support it.

Despite the fact that non-genetic factors that are *modifiable* – including diet, overweight, inactivity and environmental exposures such as smoking – account for 70-90% of mortality in the U.S.,³ physician education, training, and reimbursement are focused on treating disease using drugs and surgery rather than comprehensive patient-centered treatments focused on the individual. This emphasis should give us all cause for serious concern, because it is perpetuating a system that is far too costly and increasingly ineffective for the prevention and management of chronic diseases whose root causes are to be found in a much more complex perspective on patients' lives.

The 20th century took on – and, to a great extent mastered – the challenges of providing healthcare for acute conditions (injury and life-threatening illness). At the same time that our healthcare system was focusing primarily on acute care, other influences were superseding acute conditions as the greatest threats to American health: increasingly stressful and sedentary lifestyles, ^{4,5,6} industrial pollution ⁷ of air, water, and earth ⁸ leading to devitalized (and sometimes dangerous ^{9,10,11}) food, overconsumption (rising rates of obesity) but undernutrition, ¹² and fragmented family and community ties (social isolation ^{13,1415}). Over time, these influences have helped to create an overwhelming burden of chronic disease that we do not yet train our healthcare providers to treat or prevent effectively. ¹⁶ Effective prevention of chronic disease today requires understanding individual genetic vulnerabilities (20-30% of chronic disease risk) and the effect of lifestyle upon those individual variations (70-80% of the risk). This is the domain of functional medicine.

In addition to prevention strategies, many complex, chronic diseases are very responsive to dietary and various lifestyle interventions. ¹⁷ But clinicians without these skills are literally at the mercy of the pharmaceutical industry. "... doctors are taught about drugs by agents of the pharmaceutical industry, which works hard to persuade them to select the newest and most expensive medications – even in the absence of scientific evidence that they are any better than older, less costly ones." Or, we would add, even in the presence of evidence that many non-drug interventions are therapeutically effective and significantly less expensive. ^{19,20}

Functional medicine is not a unique and separate body of knowledge, but it does represent a different way of applying the scientific and clinical information that emerges from the research literature and from the clinical practices of many disciplines. Functional medicine emphasizes a definable and teachable process of integrating multiple knowledge bases within a pragmatic intellectual matrix that focuses on functionality at several levels as the key to health. Functional medicine uses the patient's story as an essential tool for integrating diagnosis, signs and symptoms, and evidence of clinical imbalances into a comprehensive approach to improve both the patient's environmental inputs and his or her physiological function.

Chronic illness and multiple comorbidities are difficult to handle because the fundamental, underlying clinical imbalances have not been clearly delineated as the starting point. Functional medicine can substantially improve the existing Chronic Care Model, 21 by providing an intellectual matrix that can filter research and clinical evidence to achieve a coherent focus applicable to the unique set of signs and symptoms presented by the individual patient.

Rabinowitz and Poljak²² commented in 2003 that we are seeing the emergence of a new primary-care model built on the molecular medicine discoveries of the last 50 years. This model integrates the concept of host/environment interaction in framing a better understanding of the origin of disease and its potential treatment, individualized to the patient. One major environmental factor that modifies gene expression is the individual's nutritional status Both macro- and micronutrients can influence the expression of genes, the translation of the genetic message into active protein, and that protein's ultimate influence in controlling metabolic function. 23.24,25,26,27 Functional medicine incorporates these critical concepts into an organized, patient-centered, and science-based approach to improving the management and prevention of complex, chronic disease.

The Institute for Functional Medicine (IFM) educates physicians and other healthcare providers in understanding the etiology, prevention, and treatment of complex, chronic disease. IFM is an independent, nonprofit educational organization dedicated to integrating the science-based best practices of established and emerging care into an effective and cost-efficient approach to treatment that can be taught to practitioners and delivered to patients using the Functional Medicine Matrix Model. For more than a decade, the Institute has functioned as a credible, effective, multidisciplinary voice for improving health care. IFM recently received reaccreditation with commendation (six-year approval) from the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME), and has published the first-ever Textbook of Functional Medicine.

The Medicine We Do: Real Reform of Healthcare

There is nothing more difficult to carry out, nor more doubtful of success, nor more dangerous to handle, than to initiate a new order of things. For the reformer has enemies in all those who profit by the old order, and only lukewarm defenders in all those who would profit by the new order.

-Niccolò Machiavelli, The Prince and The Discourses

In February 2009, The Institute of Medicine held a summit on Integrative Medicine and the Health of the Public at the National Academy of Sciences. Six hundred key leaders and stakeholders in healthcare including educators, scientists, community leaders, practitioners, lawmakers, policy makers, and insurance leaders attended it. It was a broad coalition that came together with a common purpose to change not only the way we do medicine, but also the medicine we do.

The conversation at The Institute of Medicine focused not, as one might expect, on incorporating alternative treatments into healthcare but on truly integrating healthcare. Key models advanced included implementation of healthcare teams for chronic disease, the medical home, and a fundamentally different framework for diagnosis and treatment framed by Dr Ralph Synderman, Chancellor Emeritus of Duke University, as "prospective" medicine-participatory, preventive, predictive, and personalized. This is the clinical model and framework for practice developed by the Institute for Functional Medicine. Dr Wayne Jonas of the Sameuli Institute presented his model for a national wellness initiative (WIN) that provides a framework for creating a culture of health and wellness through public and private efforts across diverse sectors and industries of our society.

The same week Senator Kennedy's (D, Massachusetts) Senate working group on healthcare reform held hearings on integrative and functional medicine. My testimony echoed calls from Dr Memhet Oz for mobilizing a national health service corps (HealthCorps) to "educate the student body" through health coaches. Dr Dean Ornish underscored that lifestyle approaches to heart disease and prostate cancer have been proven to be more effective and cost effective than medication or surgery.3 And Dr Andrew Weil emphasized the importance of transforming medical education to train a new generation of practitioners in integrative medicine. A number of us met afterward with Senators Harkin (D, Iowa) and Mikulski (D, Maryland) and their key healthcare advisors, who are allies in moving this agenda forward. I also met with key policy makers in the White House.

There seems to be no lack of understanding of the issues, but rather a lack of clarity around key strategies for how to implement changes with policy levers that

currently exist. I believe that key avenues for sustainable change are being overlooked. We are at a turning point for healthcare and our nation that is latent with possibility but fraught with danger. I live on the ground as a practicing doctor with real people suffering real problems that have real solutions being overlooked—solutions that hold the key to saving our healthcare system from self-destruction. With healthcare costs approaching 20% of the gross domestic product, now at \$2.5 trillion, or \$8160 per person annually, and the projected depletion of the Medicare trust fund in less than a decade, changing financing and delivery methods for more of the same model of care that has been proven to cost more and result in poorer outcomes, is necessary but not sufficient for effective healthcare reform.

I fear that President Obama's call for prevention may be little more than the implementation of the Clinical Preventive Care Task Force Guidelines, which, while important, are not true prevention but simply early detection. I also fear that simply addressing healthcare reform without addressing the systems-wide issues across all sectors of society that affect the health of our nation and healthcare costs will fail.

Areas outside the direct domain of healthcare such as intellectual property laws, for example, could encourage private industry to develop products and services that promote health and wellness rather than generate profit from sickness and obesity. Education policies must support transformation of schools as incubators of health rather than disease. How can we feed our children for learning and thriving when so many school kitchens have only deep fat fryers and microwave ovens? Government agencies and departments with domains that impact health such as the Departments of Agriculture, Health and Human Services, Transportation, Education, Defense, and the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), etc, must be coordinated to create a culture of health and wellness.

I have no doubt that when applied well, the personalized systems medicine approach based on functional medicine as a scalable model for medical practice, education, and research, can dramatically improve outcomes while reducing costs, providing a real solution to our healthcare crisis. Creating the incentives to build this approach and delivering it through integrated healthcare teams, including health educators/coaches driven by the operating system of functional medicine, has to be part of the solution.

Even if we get everything else right in healthcare reform—such as payment reform, universal access, electronic records (currently conceived of as simply transferring the 19th- and early 20th-century medical records system to the computer rather than facilitation of a fundamentally new way to practice medicine based on whole systems analysis), reduction of medical errors, malpractice reform, funding of comparative effectiveness research between drugs or procedures rather than lifestyle or integrated approaches—none of our efforts will matter unless we address the true drivers of cost and chronic disease.

This is a national security issue that threatens our standing in the world. As President Obama stated, "Fixing healthcare is no longer only a moral imperative, but a fiscal imperative." But opponents will not go quietly into the night. As reported recently in The New York Times, there is an insidious presence of pharma and industry in medical

education, research, and practice that prevents the best evidence on lifestyle medicine from becoming the standard of care. Harvard medical students petitioned for education free of pharma bias and limits on consulting and payments by pharma to faculty members, one of whom had 47 industry affiliations, and many of whom received tens to hundreds of thousands of dollars in payments.⁵

A recent JAMA review that examined the basis for clinical practice guidelines for evidence-based medicine (EBM) found that only 11% of guidelines are based on firm clinical evidence (level of evidence A); most are based on "expert" opinion (level of evidence C). Of guidelines with good evidence (level A), only 19% are Class I recommendations (general agreement among experts that treatment is useful or effective). These clinical practice guidelines considered "best evidence" are heavily influenced by what we have done (driven by pharma), not what we should do (based on evidence for systems medicine). Medical device and pharma industries routinely pay consulting fees and payments to physicians who promote their products, often without evidence of benefit or for off-label uses. Eli Lilly and Company (Indianapolis, Indiana) recently paid \$1.4 billion to settle criminal charges that it illegally marketed Zyprexa, an anti-psychotic drug, and Pfizer (New York, New York) set aside \$2.3 billion in fines for illegally marketing Bextra.

Dr Peter Green, the world's expert on gluten, found in a study of 10 million subscribers to CIGNA (Philadelphia, Pennsylvania) that correctly diagnosing celiac disease would result in a 30% reduction in healthcare costs by decreasing utilization (oral communication, March 2009), yet this is not advanced because there is no pharma marketing for testing or treatment of gluten intolerance, something that affects 3 million to 10 million Americans, only 1% of whom are diagnosed.

Clearly we cannot afford incremental reform, but what I read and hear about the types of strategies and polices reported in the media from the current administration concerns me, because it sidesteps the real issues of the drivers of costs and disease. A coordinated effort across government agencies and industry sectors focusing on health and wellness, incorporating what we already know, is urgently needed. I support the idea of a White House team based on the ideas put forth in the Wellness Initiative for the Nation (WIN) proposal⁸ put forth by Dr Jonas as a way to develop an ongoing vehicle for coordination of strategy and policy.

Certain ideas, while radical, seem obvious to me if we are to create real change and avert disaster. Horse-and-buggy makers gave way to the automobile, and 8-track manufacturers gave way to the iPod. While some industries will fade, others that promote health and wellness will flourish. These are the changes that will shift our system from sick care to healthcare. A coordinated effort at the White House level is necessary to successfully create a culture of health and wellness and transform our healthcare system.

The following are strategies that could have the biggest impact on cost and outcomes.

 Reimbursement must change to include payment for integrated healthcare teams focused on lifestyle treatment of chronic disease and clinical models of systems/functional medicine and wellness. Reimbursement must encourage cognitive services, patient education, and improved clinical outcomes (not pay

- for performance, which encourages increased use of procedures and testing and may not linked be to improved patient health).
- Investment for comparative effectiveness research must support comparing
 existing drug- and procedure-based medicine to lifestyle, diet, and functional
 and integrative approaches. Comparing drug to drug or procedure to procedure
 simply propagates a model already proven to be less effective than diet and
 lifestyle for most chronic disease.
- 3. Medical education must be transformed. Nutrition, lifestyle medicine, and environmental medicine must be core components of the education of health professionals and physicians. Medical education could be free, with 2 years of mandatory health service in community health centers, which would provide training in lifestyle/systems/functional medicine with integrated healthcare teams. For about \$1.6 billion per year for 67,000 medical students, we could train a new generation of physicians. Establishment of a prototype Institute for lifestyle/systems/functional medicine could develop the pedagogy and scalable curricula for medical schools, residencies, postgraduate education, and ancillary health professional education.
- 4. Improve food policy and school and community environments to encourage health by prohibiting food that is known to promote obesity and disease and providing whole, real fresh foods for our children. Obese teenagers have the same risk of premature death as heavy smokers.⁹
- Provide demonstration projects in community health centers to provide inexpensive, nutritious meals (including takeout), recreational facilities, counseling/education (eg, cooking classes), and healthcare based on systems/lifestyle/functional medicine at one location.¹⁰
- 6. Impose limits on pharmaceutical and unhealthful food advertising. More than \$30 billion is spent on marketing junk and fast food to consumers, including \$13 billion targeted at children, and more than \$30 billion is spent by pharma on marketing drugs to physicians (about \$30,000 annually per physician). Direct-toconsumer drug advertising also drives prescribing practices based on induced preferences rather than science.
- 7. Bioinformatics and electronic medical records must facilitate 21st-century systems-based and lifestyle medicine rather than 19th- and 20th-century medical records-keeping systems transferred to electronic format. 11 Healthcare teams must be linked by a scalable electronic medical record and database based on systems medicine so all clinicians can engage in uniform data collection and analysis and allow for improved clinical care, research, measurement of health outcomes, and cost savings.
- Creation of Office on Wellness, Health Promotion and Integrative Health as a
 way to develop an ongoing vehicle for coordination of strategy and policy. Focus
 specifically on developing policies and programs for lifestyle-based chronic
 disease prevention and management, integrative health care practices and
 health promotion.

Real health care reform is now possible in a perfect storm where alignment of economic, scientific and moral imperatives provides an opportunity us as a nation to do well by doing good through fundamentally changing the medicine we do. It will require the collective imagination, intention, focus and action by health care providers, consumers, industry and policy makers. In the words of the ancient Jewish sage, Rabbi Hillel, "If I am not for myself, then who will be for me? And if I am only for myself, then what am I? And if not now, when?"

Proposed Activity: "Virtual" dedication ceremony for clean energy project, with focus on Summit themes of energy security and environmental sustainability.

Suggested USG Participant: The President (or Secretary)

World GTL, a U.S. firm, is building the first commercial gas-to-liquids (GTL) plant in the Western Hemisphere in Trinidad. The project is a joint venture with Petrotrin, Trinidad and Tobago's national oil company. The plant is located in Point-a-Pierre, about 25 miles south of Port of Spain. In order not to have to travel, and to avoid having to shut down work at the plant during a visit, World GTL has proposed a "virtual" plant dedication ceremony in Port of Spain.

When production begins (expected November 2009), the plant will supply ultra-clean diesel to the adjacent Petrotrin refinery for use as a fuel additive, reducing air pollution and greenhouse gas emissions from diesel vehicles.

World GTL seeks to demonstrate that small-scale, commercially viable GTL plants can diversify fuel supplies, thereby promoting energy security as well as environmental sustainability. These are two of the three key themes of the Summit of the Americas.

GTL technology produces a clean, nontoxic and biodegradable transportation fuel that contains no nitrogen or sulfur. The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency estimates that for every unit of energy from gasoline that is replaced by GTL diesel, total lifecycle greenhouse gas emissions are reduced by 8.6%.


GTL technology allows natural gas to be economically converted into an easily transportable fuel, bringing clean energy to consumers in remote locations. Most GTL projects currently underway worldwide (for example, in the Middle East) are designed on a much larger scale and therefore require massive gas reserves. The relatively smallscale World GTL plant demonstrates that GTL technology can be commercially viable with much smaller reserves.

The project also highlights Trinidad and Tobago's track record of partnering with foreign investors to develop its energy sector, creating jobs and building local talent.

In addition to the GTL plant in Trinidad, World GTL also is in the planning stages for the first coal-to-liquids (CTL) plant in the United States.



Vets need help fighting war in their heads

President Obama's new secretary for Veterans Affairs, retired general Eric Shinseki, is coming to town Friday to visit the VA Medical Center in North Chicago.

Here's hoping he meets Maj. Shari Johnson of the U.S. Army Reserve 452nd combat support group.

Johnson, 47, is a registered nurse. But she's not on staff at the VA hospital. She's a patient who just checked herself in on Sunday, hoping and praying that she can learn to turn down the volume on the war that's raging in her head.

Two years ago, I wrote about Johnson and her husband, Sgt. Mike Johnson, who also is a nurse

Both were sent to Afghanistan in 2003. Both were assigned to the hospital at Bagram Air Base in Parwan province. Both suffer from post-traumatic stress disorder.

Mike had already been diagnosed with PTSD in after serving in the 1990 Gulf War -- but the Army called him up again anyway.

Duty in Afghanistan profoundly affected them both.

At Bagram, Shari treated children whom the Taliban had placed in boiling water up to their waists as their horrified parents looked on. It was a way of punishing the parents for collaborating with Americans. One of Mike's jobs, meanwhile, was to meticulously prepare dead soldiers for the trip home to grieving families, piecing them back together and dressing them with care so that if coffins were opened, they could be presented with the full dignity they deserved.

Six months after returning home to their small farm in Downstate Sheldon, the aftershocks began. Shari told me in 2005 that she started, "crying all the time . . . not wanting to go anywhere. I just wanted to hide out."

Mike, whose medications covered a small table in the living room, couldn't sleep, couldn't cope easily with crowds or with vehicles pulling up behind him on the highway.

The war they had left was all around them.

For awhile, both husband and wife continued their medical work at civilian hospitals, Shari in the intensive care unit of a local hospital and Mike doing emergency room medicine. But problems with anger have sidelined Mike, and though Shari still has a job, it's in the area of nursing education, not on the floor anymore with badly injured or desperately ill patients. The Johnsons are, at their very core, soldiers. They don't want to be hobbled by PTSD. They don't want pity or even sympathy. All they want is to be well again, whole again. And believe it or not, they would, if they could, go back to serve again.

If anyone understands this, Shinseki does.

As a wounded soldier who lost part of his foot in Vietnam and fought the bureaucracy to stay on active duty, Shinseki has long had a reputation of speaking truth to power across the administrations of Bill Clinton, George W. Bush and now Barack Obama.

As the debate rages over whether only the physically wounded qualify for Purple Hearts, there is an even bigger fight at hand. It has to do with how we care for the soldiers who stood strong for us, fought in time of war and protected us in time of peace.

The Center for Strategic and International Studies just released a report very much in line with the message I suggested previously, about framing our work as "building democratic institutions" rather than "promoting democracy."

The CSIS report is entitled, "Democracy in U.S. Security Strategy: From Promotion to Support."

The report says, "Support, do not promote, democracy. Promoting has become synonymous with imposing democracy. U.S. strategy should be patient, humble, cooperative, and pragmatic, and not always active and public." It outlines 5 action items for U.S. policy.

To help with your thinking on the topic, I'd like to suggest a meeting with the leadership of NDI, including Sec. Albright, who chairs NDI's board. You may know Ken Wollack, the president.

This could be a private, informal discussion, or a more formal presentation, depending on your interest. We could brief you on the major issues and trends in democracy assistance, and discuss ideas for US policy.

I'll admit to having an agenda: I hope that democracy can regain its rightful place in US policy and become a 4th D in the mantra of "development, defense and diplomacy."

I also hope the Administration can undo the damage done by Bush, and take back democracy support as a defining issue for Democrats.

Hi! Hope you're doing well. Things look to be going very well at State.

I wanted to pass along another thought, this time about our message and approach to supporting democracy around the world. This is based on my work with NDI in the Middle East and North Africa.

As you may recall, I worked with the government of Lebanon, political parties and NGOs in a number of countries. We kept running into problems with the way democracy assistance was viewed in the U.S. and abroad.

Because of Bush's belligerence and the way the Republicans talk about advancing democracy as "promoting American values" and "winning the ideological war," the word "democracy" itself was tainted.

People who should support democracy and democratic governance were suspicious or hostile. Democratic reformers in many countries were put on the defensive, and even put in danger.

The Republican approach was more about selling democracy. Karen Hughes went around delivering lectures. They ran advertising campaigns, which were not well received overseas. (That's not surprising, since polls show commercial marketing and Hollywood exports contribute to negative perceptions of America.)

This is not to belittle good work done in public diplomacy, but the general orientation toward selling democracy as a concept (particularly in the context of invading Iraq) was ineffective at best and counter-productive at worst.

In response, we developed a new way to talk about this work that would distinguish our (Democratic) approach from the Republicans.

We talked about it as "helping people build democratic institutions." This frames the U.S. as helping people on the ground, rather than lecturing them about abstract principles. "Democratic institutions" are fair elections, representative political parties, independent critizens' groups and government that is open and accountable.

We focused on the benefits to foreign publics: "Democratic institutions and processes can help people in any society resolve conflicts peacefully and improve their lives."

And to the American public: "Helping people build more democratic societies will contribute to greater peace and stability throughout the world."

This isn't to retreat from proactively advancing democracy, which Democrats have long embraced. It's framing the work in more concrete terms and focusing on the benefits to people's lives.

I hope that's useful food for thought. There's more to this, and I'm happy to chat about it if you're interested. We can also talk about the aspirational messaging, if you'd like to follow up on our previous exchange on that.

Sens. John McCain of Arizona, Lindsey Graham of South Carolina and Sam Brownback of Kansas said this week that they were disappointed with Hill's appointment, which was announced Wednesday by Obama.

During the Bush administration, Hill led nuclear disarmament talks with North Korea While considered a seasoned negotiator, Hill was regarded by many Republicans as too willing to make concessions to try to prod Pyongyang to give up its nuclear weapons.

If confirmed Hill would replace Ryan Crocker as America's top

diplomat in Baghdad

The swift negative reaction from Congress does not bode well for Hill's appointment. He would have to be confirmed by the Senate, where Democrats hold a narrow majority and procedural rules require 60 votes to cut off debate

All three senators cited a lack of experience in the Middle East to explain their opposition to Hill.

Brownback also referred to his "evasive and unprofessional" past dealings with Congress, while McCain and Graham referred to his "controversial legacy" in a joint statement released late Thursday.

"The U.S. embassy in Baghdad is the world's largest, and our next ambassador will take the helm at a particularly critical time in our efforts in Iraq," Graham and McCain wrote. "The next ambassador should have experience in the Middle East and in working closely with the U.S military in counterinsurgency or counterterrorism operations. Mr. Hill has neither."

U.S. Economic Support for Northern Ireland Peace Process

President Clinton named today James M. Lyons to be the U.S. Special Advisor to the President and to the Secretary of State for Economic Initiatives for Ireland. The President also signed September 22 a Presidential Determination which releases the \$19.6 million U.S. FY 1997 contribution to the International Fund for Ireland (IFI).

Mr. Lyons, of Denver, Colorado, was named by the President in 1993 to be the United States Observer to the International Fund for Ireland. He has been working in this capacity actively to further the fund's objectives for the promotion of economic redevelopment and reconciliation in Northern Ireland and the border counties of the Republic of Ireland.

A senior trial partner with the Colorado law firm of Rothberger, Appel, Powers and Johnson, Mr. Lyons joined the firm in 1971, concentrating his practice in complex business matters and litigation. His practice also involves international trade.

Listed in the Best Lawyers in America, he is a fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers and the International Academy of Trial Lawyers. Mr. Lyons has been honored for his public service in Colorado by the Governor and the Colorado Supreme Court. Since 1995, he has served as a trustee of the University of Northern Colorado. South African MTN to Acquire Lebanon's Investcom

Beirut & London- South African MTN will acquire Investorm for 5.5 billion dollars (4.3 billion euros) in a deal to create the biggest mobile operator in Africa and the Middle East according to MTN group chief executive Phuthuma Nhleko .

Investcom, owned by Mikati group, is based in Beirut and is also listed in Dubai, United Arab Emirates.

MTN said in a statement here: "The MTN Group and Investoom LLC announced the landmark deal to create the pre-eminent mobile operator in the emerging markets of Africa and the Middle East.

"The companies have reached an agreement on a transaction through a recommended offer in which the MTN group will offer to acquire the entire issued share capital of investcom for a total of 5.526 billion dollars (4.3 billion euros)," the company said.

The offer was priced at 3.65 dollars per share in cash, with shareholders also offered a cash and share alternative, MTN said adding that the share-price was based on investcom's closing share price on Friday.

MTN's Nhleko, says M1 Limited, which owns 70.6% of Investoom – a mobile telecommunications group with a secondary listing in London – has opted to accept a combination of cash and MTN shares for its stake in Investoom.

MTN has given investoom shareholders the opportunity to accept, instead of cash of \$19.25 per global depositary share (\$3.85 per ordinary share), an alternative offer of \$10.4047 in cash plus 0.9035 MTN shares per Investoom global depositary share.

This equates to \$2,0809 in cash and 0,1807 MTN shares per Investcom share

MTN would become the largest mobile operator in Africa and the Middle East and one of the largest players in the world, operating networks in 21 countries with a total of more than 28 million subscribers.

MTN group chief executive Phuthuma Nhleko said: "We are delighted with this transaction which delivers the next stage in the MTN Group's emerging markets growth strategy

"it substantially enhances MTN's growth prospects, securing a number of important new markets for the MTN Group."

Investcom chief executive Azmi Mikati said that the deal "represents the ideal platform for Investcom to realize its goal of being a leading emerging markets telecom enterprise"

The offer is subject to approval by MTN shareholders and the fulfillment of certain conditions, the company said, without giving details.

The Johannesburg-listed MTN had more than 23 million subscribers across 10 countries in Africa at the end of 2005.

The deal with Investcom is to add Benin, Ghana, Guinea Bissau, Liberia and Sudan in Africa to the list, as well as enlarge its business in the Middle East, notably in Syria and Yemen

Speaking at the presentation of the deal , Nhleko said this meant M1 Limited would end up with between 7% and 10% of MTN, depending on the choices of the other shareholders.

M1 was founded by brothers Taha and Najib Mikati. Taha Mikati is Investoom's chairman while Najib Mikati is the vice-chairman. Investoom CEO Azmi Mikati is Taha Mikati son.

The acquisition means former Lebanese prime minister Najib Mikati's family could own up to 10% of MTN's shares.

Najib Mikati (pictured above) was appointed prime minister of Lebanon in April (ast year after the collapse of Omar Karami's government. Mikati's role was to prepare the country for an election, after which he was succeeded by Fouad Siniora in July last year.

LEHMAN HAS TONS OF NUKE 'WA\$TE'

April 15, 2009 -

It turns out we were looking in the wrong place for weapons of mass destruction.

They weren't in Iraq.

They were in Lehman Brothers' portfolio.

The bankrupt investment bank holds as much as 500,000 pounds of uranium yellowcake — enough to make a nuclear bomb — it was learned yesterday.

And it's at least as radioactive as the toxic subprime mortgages that brought down the storied Wall Street icon.

And not only does Lehman have the yellowcake, it may have to eat it, too.

It can't get rid of the ore, because with the possible exception of North Korea, nobody is willing to cough up the price it wants — because the uranium market has tanked, sources told The Post.

And the failed firm, which just before imploding acquired the stockpile last fall, is holding off selling until prices improve, the sources said.

"We are not planning to sell at a price that's not advantageous," said a firm official who asked not to be identified.

Lehman in September sent shock waves through the nation's economy when it was forced to file for bankruptcy after the government refused to bail it out.

It sold its brokerage arm to Barclays, leaving it with what no one else wanted – from toxic subprime-mortgage loans to toxic metals.

Lehman got stuck with the yellowcake in the throes of bankruptcy - the result of a financial contract that blew up in its face, according to Bloomberg News.

Since then, the cost of the ore, used mainly to fuel nuclear-power plants, has been plummeting as the economic slowdown puts a brake on demand.

Lehman's nuclear stockpile is also helping to sink prices because no one knows when the company will drop its load into the system.

It tried to offload its yellowcake in one lump late last year when uranium was trading at close to \$50 a pound, but the price quickly pulled back.

Buyers also are concerned over the fact that Lehman's yellowcake is scattered over several Canadian facilities.

"Five hundred thousand pounds is what they hold and usually a spot deal is for 100,000 to 200,000 pounds," said Jonathan Hinze, vice president of international operations at Ux Consulting Co.

Hinze said Lehman would probably get a better price if it sold its holdings piecemeal and moved it all to one location.
