Dear Mr. Marshall:

I refer to our letter dated April 29, 2016, regarding the release of certain Department of State material under the Freedom of Information Act (the "FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. §552.

Our review is ongoing and we have determined that 21 additional documents may be released in full, 112 may be released with excisions, and 5 must be withheld in full under FOIA Exemption 6, 5 U.S.C. §552(b)(6). All released material is enclosed.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions and other grounds for withholding material. Where we have made excisions, the applicable exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released.

During her trip to Mexico, Secretary Clinton was 'lauded' by the local news media and Mexican politicians. President Felipe Calderon's government applauded an Obama administration plan, announced Tuesday, that will target the cartels by placing more U.S. agents and other personnel along the border. And the news media and Mexican politicians lauded Clinton's frank declaration of blame as long overdue. [Los Angeles Times, 3/27/09]

Secretary Clinton has 'come into her own.' Lara Logan: "Well, she seems very much at ease. That's one of the things that struck myself and other journalists dealing with her in her new role. She has almost come into her own. She's very open, very direct, taking a lot of time. One particularly important thing to note is that she takes a lot of time to meet with local women and young people, disadvantaged groups. And I was speaking to one of her top aides about this, asking her what she hopes to get out of these meetings. And she said to me that -- 'Hillary feels it's very important to get outside the bubble.' She finds it very useful to hear from the man on the street what they think of certain policies and programs, and that that has been a very important counterweight to her understanding of the situation anywhere she goes. Secretary Clinton's approval rating is at 71%! Fewer than one in four disapprove... The former first lady, senator from New York and one-time primary rival to Obama already has clocked close to 60,000 miles in her first two trips overseas -- one journey to China, the other to the Middle East and Europe -- since becoming secretary of state in January. Bush resides once more in Texas. She was applauded vigorously by reporters at a news conference in Egypt, a highly unusual gesture from Arab journalists toward a U.S. official. Officials of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization, some of whom felt shut out by the Bush administration, grilled her in a private meeting on the Obama administration's intentions, then applauded as well. Sergei Lavrov, Russia's foreign minister, applauded the administration's moves and promised to collaborate on issues such as arms treaties, Iran and nonproliferation. [Los Angeles Times, 3/8/09]

Parliament President Hans-Gert Poettering 'was effusive in his praise' of Secretary Clinton's presentation with NATO foreign ministers. Fellow foreign ministers stood and applauded Clinton's presentation at a meeting with NATO counterparts Thursday. Parliament President Hans-Gert Poettering was effusive in his praise, saying that with the new administration, the United States and Europe once again "share the same values." "What you said mostly could have been said by a European," he told Clinton after she fielded questions ranging from climate change to energy security to aid to Africa. [Los Angeles Times, 3/8/09]

When she spoke to hundreds of young political activists at the European Parliament on Friday, President Hans-Gert Poettering gushed that there is "enormous goodwill toward you" in Europe. The Secretary's invitation to Iran to participate in a conference on Afghanistan went over 'positively.' On Saturday, Iran responded positively to Clinton's plans to invite it to the conference on Afghanistan, an overture that could bring the secretary face to face with her Iranian counterpart by the end of the month. "The U.S. and global powers have

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realized that the issues in Afghanistan cannot be solved without the presence of the Islamic republic," Gholam Hossein Elham, a spokesman for the Iranian government, told reporters in Tehran. [Washington Post, 3/8/09]

Russian Foreign Minister said that he and Secretary Clinton had a 'wonderful personal relationship.' The dinner meeting in Geneva on Friday with Russian Foreign Minister Sergei Lavrov yielded no breakthroughs on arms control, missile defense or other thorny issues. But the atmospherics were strikingly different than Lavrov's often-stormy sessions with Clinton's predecessor, Condoleezza Rice. "I hope Hillary will agree with me," said Lavrov after the two diplomats emerged from the dinner. "I venture to say we have a wonderful personal relationship." [Washington Post, 3/8/09]

Secretary Clinton's favorability ratings are at an all time high. The US does not want to be tied to "old formulas" in moving the diplomatic process forward, US Secretary of State Hillary Clinton told Prime Minister-designate Binyamin Netanyahu on Tuesday in a meeting Netanyahu described afterward as "important, deep and very good." Abbas's spokesman also welcomed Clinton's comment on Tuesday that her country will be "vigorously engaged" in the establishment of a Palestinian state. "It's a positive step from the secretary," he said. "We urge her to continue her efforts to convince the [next] Israeli government to stop the settlement activities... These are important steps to pave the way for a new process that might lead to peace." [Jerusalem Post, 3/4/09]

In Damascus, Clinton's announcement was greeted as tangible evidence that Syrian-U.S. relations will improve. "It is obvious that this administration realizes that the deterioration of the relations between Syria and the U.S. was caused by the lack of dialogue, and it also realizes what such a dialogue could mean in terms of the stability and peace of the region," said Elias Murad, editor in chief of al-Baath newspaper. "The authorities here are relaxed. They think Obama has sent a number of positive and eager messages," said Thabet Salem, another Syrian journalist, citing the appointment as Mideast special envoy of former senator George J. If the Obama administration had persisted along that course, it would have been very difficult to expect Chinese cooperation on global issues. Moreover, the US also wants China to continue to lend it large amounts of money by purchasing Treasury bonds. Throughout her tour of Japan, Indonesia, South Korea and China, it might be said that Clinton aggressively projected a nonconfrontational foreign policy -- and rightly so. According to State's latest report on Egypt, issued Feb. 25, "the government's respect for human rights remained poor" during 2008 "and serious abuses continued in many areas." It cited torture by security forces and a decline in freedom of the press, association and religion. Ms. Clinton was asked about those conclusions during an interview she gave to the al-Arabiya satellite network in Sharm el-Sheikh, Egypt. Her reply contained no expression of concern about the deteriorating situation. "We issue these reports on every country," she said. "We hope that it will be taken in the spirit in which it is offered, that we all have room for improvement." Ms. Clinton was then asked whether there would be any connection between the report and a prospective invitation to President Hosni Mubarak to visit Washington. "It is not in any way connected." And her aides generally refused to comment about what she said in the meetings, despite constant queries from reporters traveling with her. In contrast, the Israeli press has carried candid assessments of Clinton's meetings here. For example, late Tuesday night, instead of a briefing from a real person, reporters were e-mailed "background information," which could be attributed to a "U.S. official." The missive set a new standard for useless information. She gave the impression that the Obama administration is preparing to downgrade human rights and freedom of expression in American foreign policy. She seemed oblivious to the European Union's commitment to a sanctions policy and unaware that the Association of Southeast Asian Nations is sensitive about having Burma's pariah regime in its midst. She also seemed forgetful of President Obama's comparison of Nobel Peace Prize laureate Aung San Suu Kyi to Nelson Mandela. Clinton made another kind of gaffe when she said pressing China on human rights "can't interfere with the global economic crisis, the global climate change crisis, and the security crisis." Even if these were her priorities in talks behind closed doors with Chinese officials, her comment sent the wrong message to those officials, to Tibetans and Chinese democrats, and to human rights defenders in China. Worse yet, Clinton justified her intent to soft-pedal human rights by saying, "We know what they're going to say, because I've had those conversations for more than a decade with Chinese leaders." This remark betrays two stunning assumptions: that American protests about human rights abuses have no effect on Chinese authorities, and that US-Chinese cooperation is possible only if the United States kowtows to Beijing's insistence on what it calls non-interference in its domestic affairs. Secretary Clinton sounded like 'continuity with the Bush administration.' Hillary Rodham Clinton prefaced her first trip abroad as secretary of State with a speech Friday sketching out various Obama administration views regarding her Asia itinerary. Her approach on the crucial issue of North Korea's nuclear weapons program embodies an overwhelming -- and unfortunate -- continuity with the Bush administration. Secretary Clinton was faulted for not referencing the 'global scope of North Korea's threat.' The omission is all the more striking because Clinton also said that "we can no longer approach our foreign policy solely country by country, or simply carving the world into separate regions." She then proceeded to do just that, ignoring, among other things, North Korea's missile cooperation with Iran and its attempt to replicate its Yongbyon reactor in Syria (until the site was destroyed by Israel in September 2007). The secretary's comments at a subsequent news teleconference only compounded the speech's lack of strategic breadth. Asked her assessment of the Agreed Framework, the Pyongyang-Washington agreement concluded during her husband's presidency, Clinton regretted that "the Bush administration completely walked away" from the agreement. She said that "information" about North Korea's uranium enrichment efforts "should have been dealt with very seriously" but "in addition to the Agreed Framework," not in place of it. This is a breathtakingly confused position. First, North Korea's repeated violations of the Agreed Framework breached the agreement, not the Bush White House. General Zinni said he met for more than an hour with Mrs. Clinton, discussing a wide range of Iraq issues with her; James B. Steinberg, one of her two appointed deputy secretaries; and William J. Burns, the under secretary of state for political affairs. "She thanked me for taking this, and we went over what needed to be done," General Zinni said. "She turned to Steinberg and Burns and said: 'Let's get the paperwork moving. We've got to move on this.' " The next day, General Zinni said, Vice President Joseph R. Biden Jr. called to thank him for taking the job. But that was the last word on Iraq that General Zinni said he heard from the administration. The call he was told to expect from Mr. Burns never came, General Zinni said, and when he called each day to check on his status, he said, Mr. Burns sounded increasingly vague. With decisions to make on withdrawing from corporate boards and recruiting aides, General Zinni said he called General Jones on Monday. General broke the news: "It's going to be Chris Hill," General Zinni said he was told. "As a sorry offer to placate me, they offered ambassador to Saudi," he said in a separate e-mail message, referring to Saudi Arabia. "I told them to stick it where the sun don't shine." ...General Zinni said he was more mystified than angry. "I don't have a problem if they change their mind, but no one even bothered to call me. This is Leadership 101. To this day, no one has told me what happened." [New York Times, 2/6/09]

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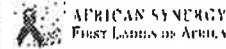
The abrupt departure of the State Department's global AIDS coordinator has led to debate over who should run what may be President Bush's most important achievement: his commitment of billions of dollars to fighting AIDS overseas. The State Department said Friday that Dr. Dybul was required to submit his resignation and leave his post because he was a political appointee of the Bush administration. "And that's all that was," said the spokesman, Robert A. Wood. He noted that Dr. Dybul had been treated the same as other Bush appointees. Dr. Dybul did not return phone messages, but he has told friends that he does not even know who decided his resignation should take effect, after he had been asked to stay temporarily. "He deserved better," said a friend who asked not to be identified for fear of jeopardizing his government job. "He didn't want to stay, but he was asked to." [New York Times, 1/30/09]

Proximity to the Secretary is everything on the 7th floor of the State Department building, and we hear that the much-respected Burns, the under secretary for political affairs (or "P"), and his staff have been bumped from the relatively central office suite normally reserved for P and unceremoniously reassigned to the less-desirable "G" suites down the hall. The folks in the G offices (normally for the under secretary for global affairs) are apparently being bumped even farther down the hall to the "R" offices, normally occupied by the under secretary for public diplomacy. Where the R folks are going is anyone's guess, but it's presumably the far-from-coveted 6th floor -- hardly a good message to send about the importance of public diplomacy under a new administration. We hear rank-and-file foreign service officers (FSOs) are none too happy with the move, which is considered a slight to Burns, a career diplomat who is the highest-ranking FSO in the country. One former government employee with good contacts at State put it to MS this way: Most comments I've heard thus far about reaction in the building aren't quite suitable for print. But I think it can be summed up with a supremely cynical "oh, so THAT's how they're going to treat us." But can share one good reaction: "forget hopes Hilary will work out at State....we're right back to the worst of the Albright days, only with bigger egos." AFRICAN FIRST LADIES HEALTH SUMMIT



AFRICAN FIRST LADIES' NGO TO HOLD FIRST-EVER SUMMIT IN U.S.

Los Angeles, CA – African Synergy Against AIDS and Suffering, an NGO of 22 first ladies from Africa, and US Doctors for Africa (USDFA), are planning the largest, and first-ever U.S.-based, summit, "Leadership for Health," in Los Angeles, California, April 20-21, 2009. This two-day summit, focused on HIV/AIDS, maternal and child health, and girls' education, will highlight the first ladies' previous initiatives in these areas, forge new partnerships with U.S.-based agencies and corporate foundations, and identify actionable goals for the coming year.

The summit will be convened by African Synergy and USDFA. USDFA is a non-profit organization that unites the African and American medical communities in a shared fight against HIV/AIDS and other diseases. The summit will be hosted by RAND Corporation, an independent, non-profit organization that helps improve policy and decisionmaking through policy and analysis. Organizing partners include: Packard Foundation, Procter & Gamble, General Electric, World Health Organization, Vital Voices Global Partnership, White Ribbon Alliance, AllAfrica.com, ONE, Until There's A Cure and UCLA. Partners are working in collaboration with the USDFA and African Synergy teams to develop summit objectives and thematic tracks.

This alliance of 22 first ladies, known as African Synergy Against AIDS and Suffering, formed in 2002 with the aim of "pooling our efforts for more concerted and concrete action to alleviate suffering" and fighting HIV/AIDS throughout Africa. Collaborations to date include the opening of maternal health clinics, HIV treatment centers, orphan care programs and vocational training schools in Guinea, Niger, Burkina Faso, Burundi, Mali and Cameroon; as well as numerous other initiatives and advocacy efforts throughout all 22 member countries.

In July 2008, African Synergy approached USDFA to begin a five-year partnership focused on expanding these efforts across the continent. The April 2009 summit will be the first undertaking of this partnership.

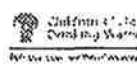

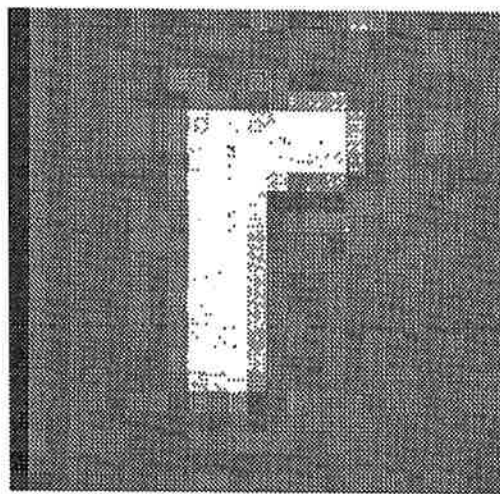
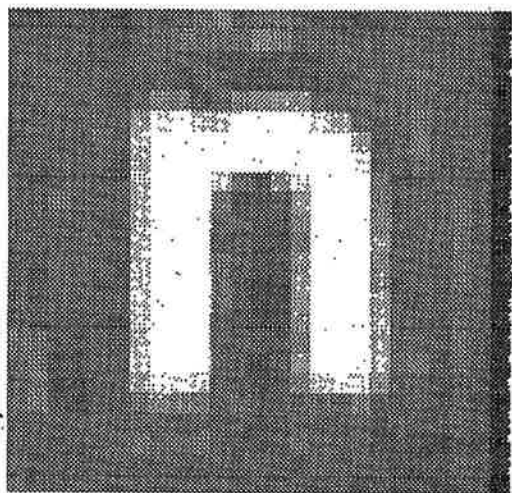

1. The supp to base comparison. Conrad's staff is still saying that there is a 40% increase in 150. Conrad himself made clear in his conversation with OMB that he knows that's not the case – that building in the supp means it's only a 7% increase. You might reinforce with him this point.
2. The treatment of IMF recapitalization (\$8-\$10 billion) IMF funding doesn't score in outlays, but it may score in budget authority (CBO has not decided). It is important to stress to Conrad that this money has a different character. It is not real money. It is not interchangeable with other money in the budget. It is either there for the IMF or it is not there at all – you can't cut IMF funding and reallocate to aid, for example. For these reasons, our budget submission didn't foreshadow IMF funding, and it should not be treated as part of the regular budget.

Frank Lowenstein from SFRC (a former student of mine) just called me very excited to tell me that he had just received the intent to nominate me for L from the White House. They want to put me into a hearing along with Johnnie Carson, and have Feingold chair it (which would make sense, since he is Africa subcommittee; [redacted] years ago, and told Kerry he wants to chair my hearing). Frank just met with Lugar's people, and asked them if they could have such a hearing on April 2 (Thurs) next week, just before they go out of session. They are thinking about it. They could then try to get a unanimous consent vote on L and AF on April 21 at the first business meeting when they come back into session, and we could both be confirmed by April 27-28.

He said this scenario turns on two things:

1. H getting nomination papers for me and Johnnie in by Wednesday. H had apparently promised nomination papers for Johnnie Carson last week, but has not delivered them to his knowledge. Mike Polt told me last Friday that my papers were ready to go and could go to SFRC today or tomw.
2. H indicating orally or in writing that these two appointments are a priority for the Secretary. Apparently a similar intervention on behalf of Rose G by HRC made her hearing happen before the recess, as Lugar wants to be very attentive to her concerns re scheduling.

I thanked Frank, and said that I am not my own H, nor do I control HRC's priorities, but that I would pass this information along to the Seventh Floor. I will also tell Mike Polt when I talk to him later today, so he knows I got the call.

Rest assured that I want to work on whatever timetable works for S and H, but I thought you would want to know what Frank said, in case his two suggested steps make sense to you.

I enjoyed the opportunity to discuss the emerging potential that Haiti presents with the Secretary of State and former President Clinton last night. I would like to take this opportunity to make a brief suggestion for Thursday's trip to Haiti:

We discussed the catalytic role the United States could play in leveraging much needed private investment in large scale job creation, for example through direct involvement of OPIC. In my report I pointed out that the port in Port-au-Prince is the most expensive port in the Caribbean and recommended the opening of new private ports. Ports remain a critical bottleneck to a job creation strategy both in garment manufacturing and agriculture. They also play a pivotal role in ensuring that some of the complementary imports necessary for the proposed road construction projects can enter the country both in the required quantities and in a cost-effective and timely manner. Elsewhere I have argued that spiraling prices in construction booms often mean that available funds only go half way to the finishing line.

The Haitian authorities have already made inroads in addressing some of these inefficiencies and stand ready to do more. In fact, Prime Minister Pierre-Louis noted in the letter to investors which was presented at the meeting with Charles Rangel and garment entrepreneurs on Monday, that "ISPS certification of port facilities and alleviation of customs procedures" are in progress. The meetings tomorrow may present an opportunity to emphasize once again how central well-functioning, competitive ports are to attract foreign investors as part of the HOPEII window and to put the right transport infrastructure in place.

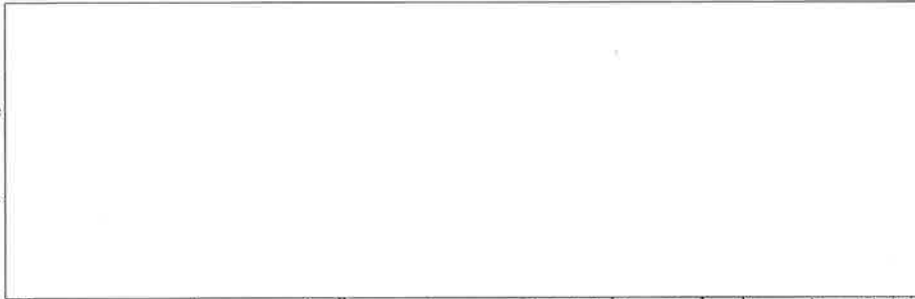


