Dear Mr. Bekesha:

I refer to our letter dated March 28, 2016 regarding the release of certain Department of State records under the Freedom of Information Act (the "FOIA"), 5 U.S.C. § 552. Pursuant to our discussions with you following the March 2016 production, we initiated supplemental searches to ensure that our response to your request was complete. Our supplemental searches included the following Department of State record systems: The Office of the Executive Secretariat ("S/ES"), The Office of the Under Secretary for Management ("M"), and the Bureau of Information Resources Management ("IRM").

The supplemental search of the records of S/ES is ongoing.

The search of the records of M is complete and has resulted in the retrieval of two documents responsive to your request. After a review of those documents, we determined that both may be released with excisions.

The supplemental search of the records of IRM is complete and the review of those records is ongoing. To date, this review has resulted in the retrieval of five additional documents responsive to your request. After reviewing these documents, we determined that one document may be released in full and four documents may be released with excisions. All released material is enclosed.

An enclosure explains the FOIA exemptions. Where we have made excisions, the applicable FOIA exemptions are marked on each document. All non-exempt material that is reasonably segregable from the exempt material has been released.

Charlie,

PAS translates to Presidential Appointee with Advice and Consent of the Senate. As examples, the Senate permits in essence the appointments of the Secretary, Deputy Secretaries, and Under Secretaries. We have had a few Schedule C's in the M bureaus, e.g., OBO. The formal relationship to M, as documented in the position description, identifies the U/S M as the supervisor, while the individual's work is completed in the bureau. Therefore, as you mention, this is not a traditional supervisor/employee relationship.

This scenario does not negate Mr. Pagliano's from working in IRM.
